<p>1. Could you kindly tell me who the data controller is for the Connected Care shared record database (as recognised by the ICO)?</p>	<p>All the partner organisations in Connected Care are Data Controllers in Common.</p>
<p>2. Could you kindly tell me whether the presence of any of the read codes</p> <p>93C1 (EMIS Web Data sharing) 9Nd1 93C3 (legacy Summary Care Record optout) 9Ndo (Summary Care Record optout) 9Nu0 (Type 1 objection) 9Nu4 (Type 2 objection)</p> <p>would automatically, and completely, prohibit extraction and uploading of personal confidential information to the Connected Care database from GP records?</p>	<p>When 93C1, 93C3 and 9Nd1 are present in a record the uploading of personal confidential data into Connected Care is completely and automatically prohibited.</p> <p>9Ndo, 9Nu0 and 9Nu4 are codes that apply to national use of personal confidential data and Connected Care is a local record sharing system therefore these codes do not prevent data being copied to the system.</p>

Could you kindly tell me whether combined information held in the Connected Care database is being, or is planned to be, used for secondary purposes (such as risk stratification, healthcare planning, research or commissioning)?</p>	<p>The information held in Connected Care is solely for the purpose of providing direct care to individuals.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> If so, please could you tell me precisely what the effect of the 9Nu0 read code (Type 1 objection) and the 9Nu4 (Type 2 objection) is on any secondary processing of the linked, personal confidential data held by Connected Care, if that objection is present in a non-dissenting patient's GP record? 	<p>Not applicable.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> If neither code has any effect, then how may patients allow primary uses (direct care) of their Connected Care record whilst prohibiting any secondary uses? 	<p>Not applicable.</p>
<p>4. Finally, if information is used, or planning to be used, for secondary purposes, which of the contributing organisations have permitted the use of their information for this, and which have only allowed their information to be uploaded and used for primary purposes?</p>	<p>Not applicable.</p>
